OK, this is just an observation from a 19 year member that is concerned about the future of our wonderful Lions Club. I just want to acknowledge that, now that the no-smoking policy has been voted in by the majority of the membership, we need to follow through for the benefit of the Club. If you are attending meetings, helping on committees, bartending, you are doing part of your pledge when you asked to become a member. Many of you do much more than this; but, for some there is more you can do. If you are a sponsor of a new member, encourage them to attend meetings, encourage them to volunteer for events and/or work projects, and get more involved yourself.

We only have 5 events throughout the year that brings in revenue for the Club and a small amount of rental income the rest of the time we are paying out to the community, because that's what we do. Plus, these profits pay for repairs, maintenance, insurance, taxes, community donations, etc.

We are very fortunate to have a Club House with a liquor license. The majority of Clubs have to meet in restaurants or not so desirable venues. So, we rely on proceeds from the bar to pay our monthly utilities bills, liquor license, permits, use tax, etc. If we could get just members to volunteer to bartend in our "smoke free environment" just one night a month, it would only take 20 to 25 out of 80 plus members. That's only 2-3 hrs out of your whole month to benefit your Club. If the bar doesn't stay open, the Club doesn't exist. You don't have to be a "bartender", only know how to open a bottle of beer and pour a few ounces of booze in a glass with some mix. I would be glad to help any one of you that would be willing to learn; let myself, Al, or Kim know if you can help out.

As Berl's presentation showed we are barely breaking even, we are a nonprofit and are not allowed to report much of a profit; but, we are allowed a certain amount to keep us afloat. So what I'm getting at is we need more members to step up and volunteer to relieve some of the work load on the ones that have been doing all the work. AND, this is a big AND, we need the people that wanted to join the Club, but wouldn't or couldn't because of the smoke, start attending meetings and show their interest. So, if you have some friends or family that are interested in becoming a Lion bring them around.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Lion Sheri requested a donation to the Marysville Youth and Civic Center. Motion was made by Lion Bill and 2nd by Lion Janet to donate \$250 to the Youth Center.
- Lion Bill update on tree planting in honor of deceased member John Stevens. Extensive discussion about the tree planting location. A place must be determined where water can be made available. The tree was purchased by the family.
