

## RV STORAGE

The rain and cold weather means putting your RV into storage mode. Remember to check with your insurance agent first, many companies allow suspension of portions of your benefits during the period of non-use, which will lower your premium.

If you are below freeze zone it is wise to pump RV anti-freeze throughout the fresh water piping system and into every P-trap. Flush just enough down the toilet and each sink to cover the bottom of each holding tank. To cut down on dust and dirt accumulation in the water heater and refrigerator exterior access panels, cut cardboard inserts and position inside the panels.

**Use blue painter's tape to cover intake and exhaust assemblies to keep insects out.** Fully charge batteries before storing and remove the ground terminals to disconnect. Unplug frig, microwave, TV, etc. incase of lightning or electrical surge.

If you use a cover, keep from rubbing on the roof or at **the edges. If you don't use a cover, at least cover the air conditioner.** Leave a roof vent cracked open at one end and a window at the other end for a bit of airflow to minimize the chance of mold or mildew.

Instead of a bunch of short runs, it is recommended to start and run the generator about once a month at half-load for an hour or so.

## FALL GARDENING

**If you're looking for bare root plants, roses arrive** in Dec and fruit trees in Jan at Bald Mtn Nursery. They also hold a clinic in Jan on the correct way to plant bare roots and tree pruning.

If you missed your November dormant spraying for leaf curl on fruit trees just pick up at Christmas and Valentines Day, just make sure the trees have lost all their leaves. Make sure you mix the dormant with a copper mix to make sure it sticks to the tree and has time to dry before a heavy rain. Now is a good time to plant your pasture or lawn seed. Recycle your pots to Bald Mtn., info courtesy of Bald Mtn Nursery.
