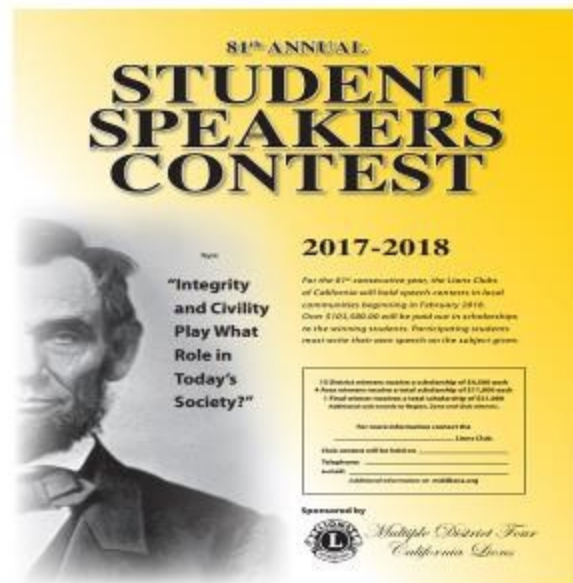
Student Speakers Contest

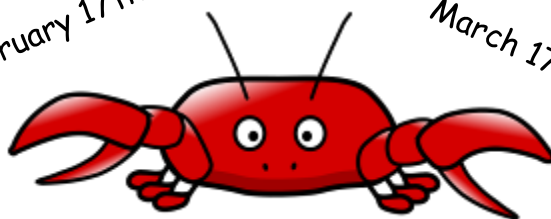
Lion Peggy Simeroth and her furry companion, Gabby, stopped by the club on their way home from town to check in and make sure everyone was safe. Thanks Peggy!
