Friendly Reminder...

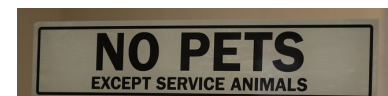
The membership voted on a new smoking policy and as of July 1, 2019, smoking will be permitted in the patio area, but not inside the building.

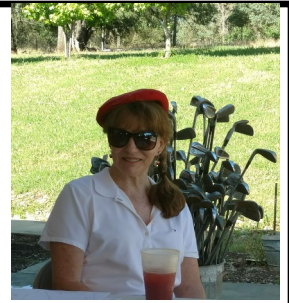

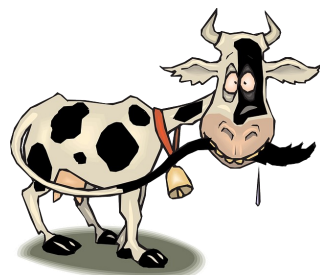
Cow Pasture Golf

Minutes – Board Meeting – June 27, 2019



Meeting called to order by incoming President John Newlin at 6:10 p.m. This is a joint meeting including both outgoing and incoming officers. There were 9 outgoing officers present with 9 incoming officers in attendance.

Treasurer Kim Hall submitted the financials for the month of June 2019 to the board. A discussion was held, questions asked, and a motion was made by Lion Joni to accept the financials as presented – 2nd by Lion Linda. Vote was held – motion passed with no opposition.

Lion Sally, Secretary, stated our current membership is 87 members, down from 89 with the death of two long-time members, Lions John Stevens and Julie Schmidt.

No agenda items were submitted prior to the meeting.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

President John asked for a volunteer for the position of Lion Tamer, due to resignation of the member selected to hold the position. There were a couple of names mentioned but no decision was made.

Lion Linda suggested that we donate \$100 to LPCCI in the name of deceased member Lion Foster Rein, as there was no celebration of life function requested by the family. A motion was made to donate \$100 to LPCCI in Lion Foster's name. Motion by Lion Jim and 2nd by Lion Cindi – passed.

Lion Al, incoming Bar Manager, asked if the ABC regulations and diagram of designated areas allowed for consumption of alcohol has been located. He requested the board ask ABC for another copy for our records. Treasurer Kim said she would contact ABC and get the requested information.

NEW BUSINESS:

Lion Jim asked for permission to recycle the cans from the bar with the funds to go to the FFA and 4-H. A discussion was held after Lion Joni said the recycle funds usually went for miscellaneous expenses such as tablecloths, flowers and other items. It was suggested that the funds from the recycling for July, August and September be donated to the FFA and 4-H clubs, that always help with our functions. A motion was made by Lion Cindi and 2nd by Lion Janet to donate these funds for the time period stated. Vote was held – passed.

Lion Cindi asked the board to pay the \$300 dues to LPCCI from Admin Funds. Motion was made by Lion Bill and 2nd by Lion Gerry to pay the dues for LPCCI. Vote was held – passed with no opposition.

Lion Cindi requested that \$100 from the LPCCI sub-account be sent to International to enter a “contest” to win \$2000 for LPCCI functions. Discussion was held – motion made by Lion Jim and 2nd by Lion Linda to submit these funds from the Adm. Account to the International LPCCI account for the “contest” for \$2000. Vote held – passed.

OTHER BUSINESS:

President John told the board he would like to invite speakers from the community businesses and agencies to speak at the General Meetings on various subjects as long as it they don't take up too much time. The board liked this suggestion.

President John – we need signs for posting the new “No Smoking” policy at the club house. In addition, it was suggested that we need a “No Dogs Allowed – except certified service dogs” in the club house. We all love our dogs, but they don't belong inside the building except certified service dogs. Treasurer Kim said she would pick some up. President John asked that Lion Laurie, bulletin editor, put something in the next edition to remind the members about the changes in policy.

OTHER BUSINESS (Continued):

Lion Al, Bar Manager, stated the ice machine is broken. We need a service call to find out if it can be repaired or we may need to replace it. Treasurer Kim will call someone to come out to check it out. Lion Janet will bring 4 large bags of ice for the Friday Night bar activities and Lion Al will bring ice for the function on Saturday, June 29th.

Lion Cindi asked that a committee be selected to make plans to clean, sanitize and paint the bar after the “No Smoking” policy goes into effect on July 1st. The Club Manager has a monthly fund for maintenance which should cover the expenses. Further discussion will be held on this activity as the Club Manager was absent.

Motion to adjourn the meeting by Lion Joni and 2nd by Lion Linda at 7:15 p.m. Vote – passed.

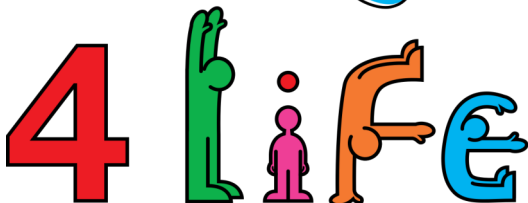
