

#### MINUTES - BOARD MEETING - MAY 23, 2019



Meeting called to order at 6:00 pm by President Sheri. 12 members present with 4 guests.

President Sheri decided to take care of counting the ballots received from the general membership regarding the proposed change in the "smoking policy" inside the building as the first order of business. President Sheri advised the board that 14 ballots were received without a name or return address. She asked if the board wanted to accept the 14 ballots or not. A vote was held with 7 members voting to accept the 14 ballots and 4 voted against since the instructions were not followed. The ballots were added to the others for counting. President Sheri requested that Lion Susie and Lion Kim count the ballots after they were opened. President Sheri and Secretary Sally sat on the stage in full view of the board. President Sheri opened the ballot while Secretary Sally checked off the name on the membership roster. The ballots were removed from the envelope and remained folded – then picked up by the counting members. After the ballots were counted, Lion Kim presented the results to President Sheri. One ballot was disqualified due to comments added to the ballot that would identify the ballot was received from a member who had resigned and was not eligible to vote. The count of the ballots was 55 in favor of a non-smoking policy and 23 voting for no change in smoking policy. The results affirmed the desire of the general membership for a non-smoking facility. One of the guests attending the ballot counting was Past District Governor Paul Halcomb. We thank you for being present to observe.

Treasurer Kim submitted the financials to the board. Discussion was held – correction noted that \$4000 was not a donation but was a dispersal of Fire Funds. A motion was made by Lion Bill and  $2^{nd}$  by Lion Gertie to accept the financials as presented by the Treasurer. Vote – MSP – 1 opposed.

Secretary Sally submitted \$560 to the Treasurer in dues payment.

#### UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

- President Sheri Line Dancing discussion. President Sheri stated she thought a contract should be made with the Line Dancing Instructor. After much discussion, it was decided that we would charge a flat rate of \$100 for the hall rental for the Tuesday Line Dancing group. No further fees would be required. President Sheri said she would discuss the matter with the instructor.
- Lion Susie The Scholarships to Marysville High School will be held on Tuesday, May 28, 2019. Treasurer Kim will attend with Lion Susie to take pictures. Other members may attend if they wish. We will have 3 scholarships – (1) \$1000 and (2) \$500.
- Lion Gerry update on June 1<sup>st</sup> Cow Pasture Golf. Lion Deloris will be furnishing the food for the event. Lion Gerry said Lion Deloris wanted to volunteer to thank all our members who work so hard on other events. A Big THANK YOU to Lion Deloris. RAFFLE prizes are requested, also sponsors for golf holes @ \$25. Lion Gerry asked about the beer for the event. The club will take care of it. President Sheri update on Memorial Day Veteran's BBQ. Lion Cindi is ready!!!
- Treasurer Kim requested funds to purchase a new laptop computer for the Treasurer. A vote was held, and it was decided to allow Treasurer Kim NTE (not to exceed) \$1000 to purchase a new computer and the programs needed to complete the Treasurers duties. The computer and programs to belong to the Club.


