

## GARDENING

They don't have the stress of the heat and the roots can take off without having to nourish their leaves. Fall fertilizing should have been done in Sept; but, not too late to do it NOW. If fall color is showing then the plant or tree is beginning to go dormant and will not use all the fertilizer you give it. Mix a pre-emergent with your weed killer to stop seeds from sprouting; but, remember NOT to use in areas where you want to plant seeds. It's also time to plant winter annuals and veggies. Just because we've had a couple rains don't stop watering, you can reduce water with cooler temperatures but don't stop until we get a good reliable rainfall. Remember to cut a drain in any basin around your trees, you don't want them to stand in water all winter. Info thanks to Jeff @ Bald Mountain Nursery, visit them if you need plants, fertilizers, accessories, or just information.

### MEET YOUR NEWEST MEMBER


