#### Minutes – Board Meeting – August 22, 2019

Meeting called to order by President John at 6:04 pm. Twelve members present with 7 guests in attendance. Four prospective new members Joline Prittie, Robert Prittie sponsored by Lion Karen Pappillon, Christel Mitchell and Terry Gallagher, sponsored by Lion Billy Mcneal were present to complete the requirements for membership, and Linda Strand from Foothill Intermediate School was present.

The Treasurer presented the financials for discussion. A motion was made by Lion Sheri to accept the financials and  $2^{nd}$  by Lion Susie – vote – MSP.

A request for reinstatement was received by Secretary Sally from former member Lulu Jacobsen, who had previously resigned her membership. A discussion was held by the board and motion was made by Lion Sheri to decline the request and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Lion Gertie. The vote held to decline Ms. Jacobsen's request for reinstatement. The Secretary will notify Ms. Jacobsen of the board's decision.

The prospective new members were introduced to the board by their sponsors. Each was asked why they wanted to join the Foothill Lions Club – after introductions the individuals were asked to leave the room for the vote by the board. The board voted to accept the applications for membership with 2 members abstaining. The induction will be held at the District Governor's Official Visitation on Thursday, September 5, 2019. After discussion, a decision was made to get further bids. A motion was made and passed to replace the back door to the building with a security system. The lower bid was accepted with the installation to be done by Lion Kenn with volunteer help.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

IPP Sheri discussed the New Year's Eve Dance. She requested a cap on the band of \$1500. The party/dance will be FREE for the members and the community. Motion was made by Lion Kim and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Lion Janet – vote – passed. (The funds for the band to be paid for through Taco Night funds).

Treasurer Kim – Discussion was held regarding beautification/maintenance of the facility. The following items were discussed; patio, painting, ceiling and septic problems. The items were tabled for further information and follow up.

#### OTHER BUSINESS:

Guest Linda Strand who is the 6/7 grade Special Ed Teacher at Foothill Intermediate School requested assistance for funding of the financial program (curriculum) in the amount of \$322. A motion was made by Lion Laurie and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Lion Sheri to donate NTE \$400 for this request. A vote was held on the motion passed.

A special Thank You to Treasurer Kim for taking over the Secretary's duties for the meeting due to health problems of the secretary.

Motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:52 p.m. by Lion Janet and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Lion Mary. Meeting adjourned.

#### Minutes of Board Meeting – September 26, 2019

Copies of the board minutes held on August 22, 2019 were given to the board members in attendance as they were not ready for the bulletin due to Secretary Sally's illness.

There were 8 members present with 4 members absent. The board has two vacancies.

The club financials were submitted by Treasurer Kim. After discussion, motion was made by Lion Sheri and  $2^{nd}$  by Lion Gerry to accept the report as submitted. Vote was held – MSP.

Secretary Sally submitted \$296 in dues funds to the Treasurer.
