
**General Meeting Minutes (August 5, 2010)**



**MEET YOUR FELLOW LION—SPIRIT ENHANCER LION HANK JUSKA**

In December of 1941, back in Long Branch, New Jersey, things were pretty much in an uproar after the Japanese attacked us at Pearl Harbor. As if it wasn't enough to cope with, my parents received an additional burden on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of the month, when Henry Francis Juska, Jr. took his first breath.

Some have said things went downhill from there, but all-in-all, I did things well enough to survive childhood in a seaside east coast Mafia run resort town. I was raised a Catholic, and so I did all those things good Catholic boys do; like attend parochial schools, serve as an altar boy, and join the Holy Name Society. Of course, one did not speak of the "extra curricular" activities of altar boys, like finishing the sacramental wine that was left in the cruet after Mass, and such.

I did the usual boy stuff: played sports, smoked cigarettes, chased girls, and would do nearly anything for a car! I became an honorary member of Neptune Hose Company #1 in the Long Branch Volunteer Fire Department at seventeen, like the other male members of my family had done. But I was looking for life after Long Branch, and joined the Navy as soon as I graduated high school in 1960. I served my entire enlistment on a Destroyer Escort home ported at Pearl Harbor. In 1964, I found myself at Treasure Island Naval Station with an honorable discharge, a pocket full of money, and no particular place to go. So, I went to visit an old shipmate who lived in Pacifica on the San Mateo County coast.

Long story short: a month later, I was still in Pacifica, broke, hung over, and in need of gainful employment. I went over the hill to Burlingame, took a test at the Western Electric Company, and was hired that same day.

As I was now a resident of Pacifica, it seemed appropriate to join their volunteer fire department, which I did, and stuck it out for twenty-four years. I met my first wife on the job (she was a clerk for Pacific Telephone and Telegraph in San Francisco) and began living the dream! The 60's in the Bay Area were quite unlike any lifestyle I had experienced.

Well, time goes on. I progressed well in my work life, assuming more responsible positions, traveling all over the country as well as China and the Philippines. I also lost wife #1 to a messy divorce along the way, and found my life partner, Penny, whom I wish you had had the opportunity to meet before her untimely passing.

After 32 years of Bell System, I called it quits. We were living in Lincoln (my last assignment was in Rocklin) and looking for a place to retire. We found an ad in the weekly Lincoln paper for a house in Browns Valley, and moved in the fall of 1995. I worked part time at Bremer's hardware in Yuba City. It was the most fun I ever had at work, and the least money I ever made.

Soon after we moved to Browns Valley, I joined the Sheriff's STARS group, since I was too old and slow to play fireman any longer. There, I met Lion Joan Anderson, who eventually convinced me I should leave my stool at the Browns Valley Bar long enough to visit the Lions Club. As you all know, I did that. I will always be grateful to Lion Joan for her perseverance. I'm happy and proud to be part of the Foothill Lion's family.
